## RISING 11<sup>TH</sup> GRADERS

- AP English Language Bridge from grade 10 to 11 (begin the curriculum early and expose students to the rigorous demands)
- Summer Language Academies to support foreign language acquisition (French, Japanese, Spanish) and not lose the progress that was made the previous year (ideal for students attempting to reach the AP level)
- SAT preparation and/or bootcamp proactively equipping rising juniors and seniors with the skills to attack this test
- Capstone opportunities especially for students that have already selected their academies
- AP Capstone begin this work in the summer with the AP Capstone Teacher to get a jump on the demands of the course (Research and Seminar = 2 Carnegie Credits and requires a lot of time especially in a 4\*4 Schedule)
